## I don't have any homework is not the real answer

We are seeing that many students need to spend more time on homework (reading, studying, preparing projects, completing assignments).

#### How much time? Minimum of:

Form I: 70 minutes

Form II: 80 minutes

Form III: 90 minutes

Form IV: 100 minutes

Students need good study habits (quiet space, good time management) and work ethic to do well in high school, and Sixth Form or the work place.

Read, read! There is no better way to improve English language skills and increase vocabulary. If your child does not have a specific assignment to complete, then they should be reading, and reviewing notes.

## How can you help your child?

- 1. Discuss your child's Personal Education Plan (PEP) and goals.
- 2. Support his/her attendance at after-school tutoring.
- 3. Encourage your child to study at home and turn in all assignments on time.
- 4. Visit with teachers at 2:00 p.m. the first Tuesday of every month.
